2019 Board Medal Assembly

You are cordially invited to attend the Standard Bank Board Medal Assembly at 08:00 on 9 January 2019 in the Adèle de Jager Hall. It is during this special assembly that our Gr 12 top academic achievers of 2018 will be awarded the board medals for which they worked so diligently.

Kindly note that a board medal is awarded to a Eunice learner only once and that matriculants qualify when they achieve five or more distinctions in the final Matric exam (excluding Life Orientation, which is not an examinable subject).

Threats to academic success

It is unfortunate to have to report that lateness, learner absenteeism and requests for early dismissal proved to be the biggest threats to academic progress in 2018. Please commit to Eunice excellence, support the staff and act as your daughter's accountability partner by dropping her off on time for school and ensuring that she does not stay away from school unless absolutely necessary.

Learners who are late for school due to emergencies and/or specific reasons must report to the office before going to class in the morning.

Subject changes

Subject changes are subject to approval by the Department of Education. The following Departmental submission dates apply.

2019 Gr 11s: 21 January 2019.

2019 Grade 10s: 31 July 2019.

Grade 11 learners were informed that no Gr 12 subject changes are allowed in 2019. 2018 Grade 11 learners may submit urgent requests to change subjects on or before 7 December 2018.

Please adhere to the submission dates stated above in order for us to assist you in the matter.

Grade 8 in 2019

Grade 8 parents of 2019 are invited to attend their daughters' first assembly as high school learners on this special day. The assembly usually finishes around 10:00 as all our board medal recipients are offered the opportunity to share their best practices with the school.

Grade 8 learners wear the Eunice sports uniform from 8 to 12 January 2019. They wear their new school uniform and blazer for the first time at formal assembly on Monday 14 January 2019.

Grade 8 learners will register and receive textbooks on 8 January 2019 during the following time slots:

Gr 8G and I: 15:00 – 16:00

Gr 8R and L: 15:30 – 16:30

Gr 8S: 16:00 – 17:00

Parents are please requested to support this initiative and to approach the day with patience as it is the first time that Grade 8s will have to register to receive their individual bar codes for textbooks received.

Grade 8s do not need their Eunice school bags during the first 3 days of school. They do, however, need their school lunch, sun block, stationery and a small notebook on these days.

The annual Grade 8 and 12 hike and picnic will take place on 12 January 2019. This outing offers our new Grade 8s and their Grade 12 mentors the opportunity to get to know one another better, whilst experiencing Eunice camaraderie and spirit in nature. The cost for this outing is R150 and must please be paid on or before 9 January 2019.

Learners will need a generous supply of sunblock, a hat, comfortable shoes and water for the outing. The fee includes entrance, picnic treats and live entertainment. Inappropriately short shorts, mini dresses and skirts have proven to be unsuitable attire for the outing.

Learners must please report to the Botanical Gardens at 7:00 and can be collected at 12:00 on the same day. Boarders will be transported there and back.

2019 Locker rentals

The cost of hiring a large locker for the duration of 2019 remains R100, whereas the cost for a small locker remains R50 per locker.

Renewal of Locker rentals

Learners who would like to renew their locker rental in 2019 can make an electronic payment of R100 for a large locker and R50 for a small locker with their name, grade and the word 'locker no. ____' on the proof of payment. Proof of payment must please be emailed to leon@ehs.co.za before or on 11 January 2019. Cash payments for renewals must please be avoided, if possible, but can be made at the finance office.

New Locker rentals

2019 Administration

Learners will be asked to confirm information as stated on the official South African School Administration and Management System. 2019 Code of Conduct

Thank you to parents who collaborated with the School Management Team, Governing Body and learners to adapt the 2019 Code of Conduct.

Kindly note that it is compulsory for learners to wear their name badges in 2019. Learners were requested to order lost name badges during the November exam and will be informed of delivery. Every Eunice learner receives a name badge free of charge upon entry to Eunice. Please assist your daughter by reminding her to wear and take care of her badge, as lost badges must be replaced at a cost of R50 per badge.

Please also note that the only other badges that may be worn in 2019 are those attained and/or applicable to positions filled in 2019.

Cell phone usage during the school day proved to be very distracting and interfered with academic focus in 2018. Please note that learners will hand in their cell phones at the start of periods (as was done during exams and formal assessment periods in 2018) in order to foster renewed focus on the responsible use of social devices. Learners may use their cell phones during break times, but we request that you do not expect your daughter to respond to messages during academic time. Learners must report to the office if they fall ill, after which Mrs Wienand will contact parents to collect learners if deemed necessary.

2019 Access Disks

Eunice strives to offer a safe and secure learning environment to all our learners and staff. It is for this reason that every family will be given a Eunice Access Disk that must please be visible when entering the grounds. Disks are replaced annually.

Displaying these disks enables the guards at the entrance gates to identify vehicles that do not enter the premises on a regular basis. Random searches might be done when vehicles or passengers seem suspicious. Please note that disks may only be displayed on parents' privately-owned vehicles.

The 2018 access disks must please be replaced with the 2019 disks and must be placed on the right-hand side of your vehicle's front screen to ensure visibility for Invicta security at the front gate. Driver's licenses and vehicle registration disks will be scanned upon visitors' entry of the grounds if the Eunice access disk is not visible.

Parents are welcome to fill in the return slip included in this Newsletter and return it to school on 9 January in order to receive free disks for registered private vehicles. Disks requested later than 9 January will be available from the front office at a cost of R10 per disk. Your co-operation in this regard is highly appreciated.

2019 Hostel Matters

Boarder parents must please note that all boarders must book into Eunice House on 8 January 2018. The hostel will be open from 8:00 – 17:30 to afford families ample time to move in. Please note that Wednesday early morning returns are not permitted. The Boarder Information guide will be emailed to you. Please take the time to study the document and discuss the content with your daughters.

This newsletter serves as a reminder that all medicine handed to learners is logged and that parents are invoiced at the end of each term to cover the cost of medicine consumed by each learner. No learner is allowed to keep her own medicine in her room unless special permission has been granted. Mrs Stroud manages the medicine from sick bay if there are learners on chronic medication who need medicine on a daily basis.

Kindly also note that all boarders are expected to be in the hostel by 19:30 on the day prior to the start of every term following Term 1. No boarder will be allowed in the hostel on the morning of the first day of each term unless prior arrangements have been made with Mr L van Rensburg.

Boarder parents will receive an electronic copy of the Hostel Guide. Please assist Eunice House staff by completing all the annexures found in the Hostel Guide for submission upon return to the Hostel in 2019. No learner will be accommodated unless the necessary documentation is completed in full and submitted on return to the hostel. 2019 Events

2019 Aquatics Festival

The Aquatics Festival will take place at Durban Girls' College from 7 – 8 February 2019. The amount of R 2 100, which includes Midmar, must be paid by the end of January.

2019 Midmar Mile

Our annual Midmar weekend will take place from 8 - 10 February 2019. Mr Shane Marais has already collected a R 1 000 deposit. The outstanding R 700 must please be paid by the end of January to ensure your daughter's place. Please use your daughter's name, grade and Midmar as the reference on electronic payments.

Grade 9 Outdoor School

Our Grade 8s (2018) have the opportunity to attend an outdoor school next year from Friday 15 February 2019 to Monday 18 February 2019 at "On Track Adventures", Hobhouse. We do support this activity since it has proven to be a highly educational event from which the Grade 9s really benefit.

The cost involved will be R940,00 per learner. This will include transport to and from Hobhouse, 8 meals and accommodation for 3 nights.

2019 School Finances

The Finance Department would like to thank the vast majority of parents who pay their School and Hostel fees promptly in terms of the school policy.

Hostel Fees

Unfortunately, we have had a few incidents of non-payment of fees during 2018. Please note that boarders' accommodation and meals cannot be subsidised by the school and that no learner will be allowed to enter the hostel unless payment or suitable arrangements have been made in advance with Mrs A Dreyer of the Finance Department. Mrs Dreyer can be contacted before 12 December 2018 at 051 410 1401.

Textbooks

Please note that the state's provision of a basic set of textbooks, which saves parents a considerable sum, unfortunately does not suffice. The purchase of certain extra resources will inevitably have to be funded by parents on an ad hoc basis. The same applies to certain workbooks which our learners use and which remain the property of the girls. A number of these workbook titles have been included in the attached stationary lists.

Textbook retrieval and the state in which books are returned remain a great concern to the school. We urge parents to stress the importance of this responsibility to their daughters as it impacts on textbook issuing in the New Year. Please assist us in this regard as we are trying to avoid implementing a system where learners have to buy and administer all their textbooks themselves.

Learners who lost textbooks during the course of the year must please refund the school in order for us to ensure that all learners receive the necessary textbooks in January 2019.

Learners who fail either to return their books to their subject educators or to refund the school before 9 January will unfortunately not receive textbooks until such responsibilities have been fulfilled by them. The cost of replacing a single textbook is R250. The Finance Office will be open until 12 December 2018 for this purpose.

(Gr 9 – 12 learners will receive textbooks during the first week of term. We recommend that learners bring an additional bag to school to transport textbooks home on these days.)

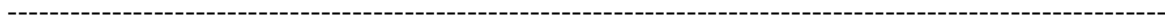
